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A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Reshaping our care model will bring a multitude of benefits to our residents as the plan takes shape in 2024, including more preventative care and health services on site, long term care in our assisted living setting as regulations allow, as well as the additional benefit of excellent skilled nursing off site through our Kline Galland partnership.

As the global pandemic receded in 2023, it was time to course correct as we adjusted to the "new normal." The long term effects of COVID lock downs will still be playing out in the months and years to come, but we needed to confront immediate challenges, most of which impacted the ability to operate a skilled nursing facility as part of our on-site care continuum. Among the many challenges that threatened the viability of skilled nursing included the growing healthcare workforce shortage and reduction in reimbursement levels. While we had been watching these challenges grow over the years, the pandemic put them over the top. By the end of 2023, it became clear that staying in skilled nursing was a threat to our sustainability, so the decision was made to shift how we provide care to better serve our residents and to ensure Bayview's viability into the future.



This shifting strategy in care provision came with much opportunity. Once the decision was made to no longer offer skilled nursing on-site, we entered into the partnership with a premier skilled nursing facility, Kline Galland. Also, we increased our level of care in Assisted Living to provide more long term care services. In addition, we created a new partnership with our outstanding therapy team, formerly of Infinity Rehab, to continue the excellent rehabilitative therapy services our residents have come to know. Reshaping our care model will bring a multitude of benefits to our residents as the plan takes shape in 2024, including more preventative care and health services on site, long term care in our assisted living setting as regulations allow, as well as the additional benefit of excellent skilled nursing off site through our Kline Galland partnership.

While charting a course through a challenging macroeconomic environment, we had much to celebrate at Bayview in 2023, including winning the gold medal in the Seattle Times Best in the Pacific Northwest People's Choice Award in the Senior Living category, named Top 50 CCRCs in the nation by a Newsweek poll, earned once again our Great Place to Work certification, as well as platinum level LGBTQ SAGE certification.

In partnership with our dedicated and talented Board of Trustees, excellent Leadership Team, and outstanding residents, we chart a bright and exciting course ahead, ensuring our ability to transform the lives of those we serve today, tomorrow, and well into the future.

Many financial challenges ultimately led to that decision, but we rapidly began to learn about many potentially better ways to offer needed care, in more appropriate locations. That important work will continue to evolve.

Our Board will be moving into 2024 excited to help support evolving new care options, needed changes to our building environment, and new ways to live, learn, and thrive together.

Bayview resident activities have regained much of their pre-pandemic vibrancy during 2023.

Food service resumed in both the dining room and Bistro, and regular happy hours have resumed in the 10th floor lounge. The resident committees have planned and presented many opportunities for cultural enrichment, entertainment, gardening, arts and crafts pursuits, game playing, and excursions to restaurants, museums, stores, and festivals.

These activities have received excellent support from Barbara Young, Director of Resident Operations and Marco Baumann, Chief Operating Officer.

The Residents' Council meets monthly except in the summer. We have elected new Floor Chairs and

Council officers and clarified our bylaws regarding the resident committees and interest groups. The meetings are now available to all residents via internet. We look forward in 2024 to further developing this community, which is our home.

Bayview residents have also reached out to support others. The Employee Holiday Fund collected over \$90,000 to provide gifts to the Bayview staff, and the Holiday Bazaar raised over \$6,400 for the Southeast Seattle Senior Center.

help sustain it. Yet with increased capacity for care within both Independent and Assisted Living, we do not anticipate a decrease in our expenditures on behalf of residents. As you can read from our fund balance below, we continue to have a healthy balance sheet. Residents and friends of Bayview are most generous, and their gifts ensure our course into the future.

LEGACY DONORS

Bayview Manor Foundation's ability to provide support to Bayview residents benefits greatly from legacy gifts. Donors participate in legacy giving by incorporating Bayview Manor Foundation into their estate planning, allowing them to leave a 'legacy' behind. Legacy gifts often occur when the donor has passed and their estate is settled, resulting in larger gifts for the beneficiary. Legacy giving takes many forms (inclusion in a will or estate plan, inclusion as beneficiary on a life insurance policy or retirement account, among others) and can be done in a way that benefits the donor prior to the distribution of the gift. Regardless of size, all legacy gifts have a positive and lasting impact on Bayview Manor Foundation and the residents of Bayview.

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SOCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY: SERVING OUR COMMUNITY SINCE 1961

What would be the "loss impact" to our own, and our surrounding, community? The dollars involved are easily quantifiable; the "heart" involved not as easily. A look into Bayview's Social Accountability program and its areas of support which includes not only dollars donated but the significant value of time and in-kind goods:

Charitable Care

This year, the Foundation subsidized six Bayview residents in independent and assisted living. The total amount paid in support of these residents was \$265,246.39. The Foundation also continued its support of the Skilled Nursing Facility, paying a total of \$125,000 throughout the year. In addition, as part of our Moderate-income program, Bayview reserves 20% of available units for residents at or below 50% of the median gross income.

Being a Good Neighbor and Supporting the Local Community

The annual Bayview Bazaar raised over \$6,000 for the Southeast Seattle Senior Center. The Southeast Seattle Senior Center provides services, activities, and support for adults 50 and older in Seattle's Rainier Valley. Many residents worked for months collecting donations, fixing jewelry, and making items, including sewn and baked goods, to sell at this year's Bazaar. In addition, Bayview Culinary Services staff prepared over 125 meals for Thanksgiving and 125 for Christmas for Oueen Anne Food Bank.

Promoting and Supporting Successful Aging & Senior Focused Not-For-Profits

Through our Social Accountability committee, Bayview made monetary donations to Queen Anne Helpline's Annual fundraising event. With the collective help of neighboring organizations, Queen Anne Helpline was able to raise more than \$94,000 for housing stability, many of whom are seniors in our neighborhood. In addition, Bayview's stitchery group spent 3,500 hours knitting for outreach organizations.

Leadership Development/Deepening the Capacity of those who Serve Seniors

Internship opportunities and mentoring were provided in sales and marketing, OT, PT, nursing, dietary and activities departments. Involvement in leadership opportunities including LeadingAge Washington's Leadership Institute; a program designed for emerging leaders in aging services and participation in speaking sessions at the state and national conferences.

Intergenerational Programs

Bayview continues to bridge the gap between seniors and children. Many residents volunteered their time and talent with our Intergenerational Children's Center students, giving over 200 hours in 2023.


